Tea Essence - Kay's Tea Essence

1 cup dry tea

4 cups freshly boiled water

- Let stand for 6 minutes.
- Drain and strain the tea. Can be stored in quart preserving jar. Use 1/2 to 3/4 cup of essence to 8 cups of boiling hot water. 1/4 cup of essence in a 4 cup carafe works well.
- This makes excellent tea for large groups in an instant.

Note: the essence will look like very rusty water but when you add it to the hot water it instantly "clears up" and the tea is ready.
