SEW A PEDAL POUCH

You will make a nonslip pouch for your sewing machine foot pedal. It will prevent your pedal from scooting around on the floor while you sew.

Bring to Monday Oct 26th meeting:

- Your sewing machine pedal (only the pedal)
- Two 2 3/4 inch strips of busy sewing themed fabric or just a busy print, press in half along length
- open and press each side to the centre press line press sides to centre again. (you have made a single fold bias tape - without the bias).
- Five or six sewing machines will be set up for your use.
- But, feel free to bring your own if you wish.
- Program will provide the black non-stick material.
- Commercial double fold bias tape will be available if you prefer.

HOW TO MAKE A QUILT:

STEP 1 - Remove cat from cutting board.

STEP 2 - Lay out fabric to be cut.

STEP 3 - Remove cat from fabric.

STEP 4 - Cut and sew pieces into a quilt top.

STEP 5 - Remove cat from quilt top.

STEP 6 - lay backing fabric out on table.

STEP 7 - Remove cat from backing fabric.

STEP 8 - Smooth out any wrinkles in backing fabric and tape down.

STEP 9 - Repeat step 7.

STEP 10 - lay batting onto quilt back and smooth out wrinkles.

STEP II - Remove cat from batting.

STEP 12 - Arrange quilt top over backing and batting.

STEP 13 - See step 5.

STEP 14 - Baste top, batting, and back together,

STEP 15 - Remove cat from basted quilt.

STEP 16 - Hand or machine quilt at your leisure.

STEP 17 - Remove cat from finished quilt... nah just let her stay there!
