Deadline to hand blocks or tops into Doffy is the first guild meeting in May, (we are not doing completed quilts) so we have time to get them to our volunteer courier who will be taking them to Quilt Canada.

Building Log Cabins for Our Injured Military (10 ½" unfinished block)

Fabric Requirements for one block:

Yellow

1 - 2 ½" square for center (#1)

White: Red: 1 - 2 ½" X 4 ½" (#4) 2 ½" square (#2) 1 - 2 ½" X 6 ½" (#5) 1 - 2 ½" X 4 ½" (#3) 1 - 2 ½" X 8 ½" (#8) 1 - 2 ½" X 6 ½" (#6)

 $1 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 10\frac{1}{2}$ " (#9) $1 - 2\frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 8\frac{1}{2}$ " (#7)

1/4" seam allowance used.

8 rows of 6 blocks (48 blocks) will give you a quilt approximately 60" X 80". No borders needed, just layer, quilt and bind.


We encourage you and/or your groups/guilds to make the blocks from Northcott fabric, not only the Oh Canada line but any one of the many beautiful lines from Northcott. You may also delve into your stash of fabric for red and white to build a Canadian Log Cabin for our injured Military. The yellow center symbolizes the welcoming light in the window, and the red and white for Canada.

This makes a 12" block!

** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



Start by marking and cutting the Color 1 7" x 10-1/2" strip into six 3-1/2" squares. Also cut the Color 1 3-7/8" square in half once on the diagonal to make two half square triangles...





Then mark and cut the Color 2 7" x 14" strip into eight 3-1/2" squares. Also cut one Color 2 3-7/8" square and cut it in half once on the diagonal to make two half square triangles...



Sew the half square triangles together as shown at left, using a 1/4" seam. Press seams to darker side. These should measure 3-1/2" square. Make two units like this...



Now piece all the squares and half squares together into four rows, again using 1/4" seams, and pressing seams in alternating directions by row. Join these rows, being sure your seams all line up...and you are done! ...on to Page 2!


