
A reminder about the “Quilts of Valour”.



Hayes' Corner

This makes a 12" block!

** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **




First mark and cut the Color 1 2-1/2" x 15" strip into six 2-1/2" squares...




Then mark and cut the Color 1 5" x 18" rectangle into eight 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles...




Now mark and cut the Color 2 2-1/2" x 15" strip into six 2-1/2" squares...




Next, speed piece the half squares, by stacking the Color 2 and Color 3 4-7/8" squares, right sides together and all edges aligned. On the back of the top square, lightly mark the diagonal, and then sew a SCANT 1/4" above and below the marked line. Cut apart ON the marked line. This will give you two half squares. Press seam allowances towards the darker fabric. Trim to 4-1/2" if needed...




Sew a Color 2 square to a Color 1 square. Make four of these pairs. Sew two pairs together to make a four patch unit. You need two!...



Then sew a Color 2 square to a Color 1 rectangle, pressing the seam allowance towards the darker fabric. You need two of these...



Now sew a Color 1 square to a Color 1 rectangle, pressing the seam allowance to one side. You need two of these...




Sew a Color 1 rectangle to the right side of a four patch unit. Press seam allowance towards the four patch. Add a Color 1 rect/Color 2 square combo strip to the bottom of that. Press seam allowance towards the rectangle unit. Make two corner units like this...on to [Page 2!](#)




Hayes' Corner - Page 2



Then sew a Color 1 rectangle to the left side of a half square. Press seam allowance towards the half square. Add a Color 1 rect/Color 1 square combo strip to the bottom of that. Press seam allowance towards the rectangle unit. Make two corner units like this...



Next piece the block, by sewing the units together as shown in the diagram at left. Press seam allowances in alternating directions with each addition to avoid bulky seams.



This quilt is just four blocks by five...with a thin Color 2 border for definition, and a slightly wider Color 1 Border... :o) Easy, yet elegant looking!

Color 1 needs: one 2- 1/2" x 15" strip AND one 5" x 18" rectangle



Color 2

Color 2 needs: one 2- 1/2" x 15" strip AND one 4- 7/8" square



Color 3

Color 3 needs: one 4- 7/8" square

Building Log Cabins for Our Injured Military (10 1/2" unfinished block)



Fabric Requirements for one block:

Yellow

1 - 2 1/2" square for center (#1)

White:

1 - 2 1/2" X 4 1/2" (#4)

1 - 2 1/2" X 6 1/2" (#5)

1 - 2 1/2" X 8 1/2" (#8)

1 - 2 1/2" X 10 1/2" (#9)

Red:

2 1/2" square (#2)

1 - 2 1/2" X 4 1/2" (#3)

1 - 2 1/2" X 6 1/2" (#6)

1 - 2 1/2" X 8 1/2" (#7)

1/4" seam allowance used.


8 rows of 6 blocks (48 blocks) will give you a quilt approximately 60" X 80". No borders needed, just layer, quilt and bind.

We encourage you and/or your groups/guilds to make the blocks from Northcott fabric, not only the Oh Canada line but any one of the many beautiful lines from Northcott. You may also delve into your stash of fabric for red and white to build a Canadian Log Cabin for our injured Military. The yellow center symbolizes the welcoming light in the window, and the red and white for Canada.


