Kaffe Faccett Jelly Roll Rug

- This adorns the entrance to Margaret's dining room sliding door.
- The size of the rug is 2 ft x 3 ft
- Its from a pattern called Jelly Roll Mug2 by **Roma Quilts**.
- Pieced and quilted by Margaret



Killbear Pine

- This was made in Spring 2020, called Killbear Pine by Joni Newman. Margaret took a course at Heather's to learn the technique.
- It's 22" x 27". Very Group of Seven influence
- Pieced and quilted by Margaret



Attic Windows

- This is a lap sized quilt (no pattern) that Margaret made for her horse crazy granddaughter last spring.
- Pieced by Margaret
- Quilted by Lori Dewart



Baby Quilt

Margaret S

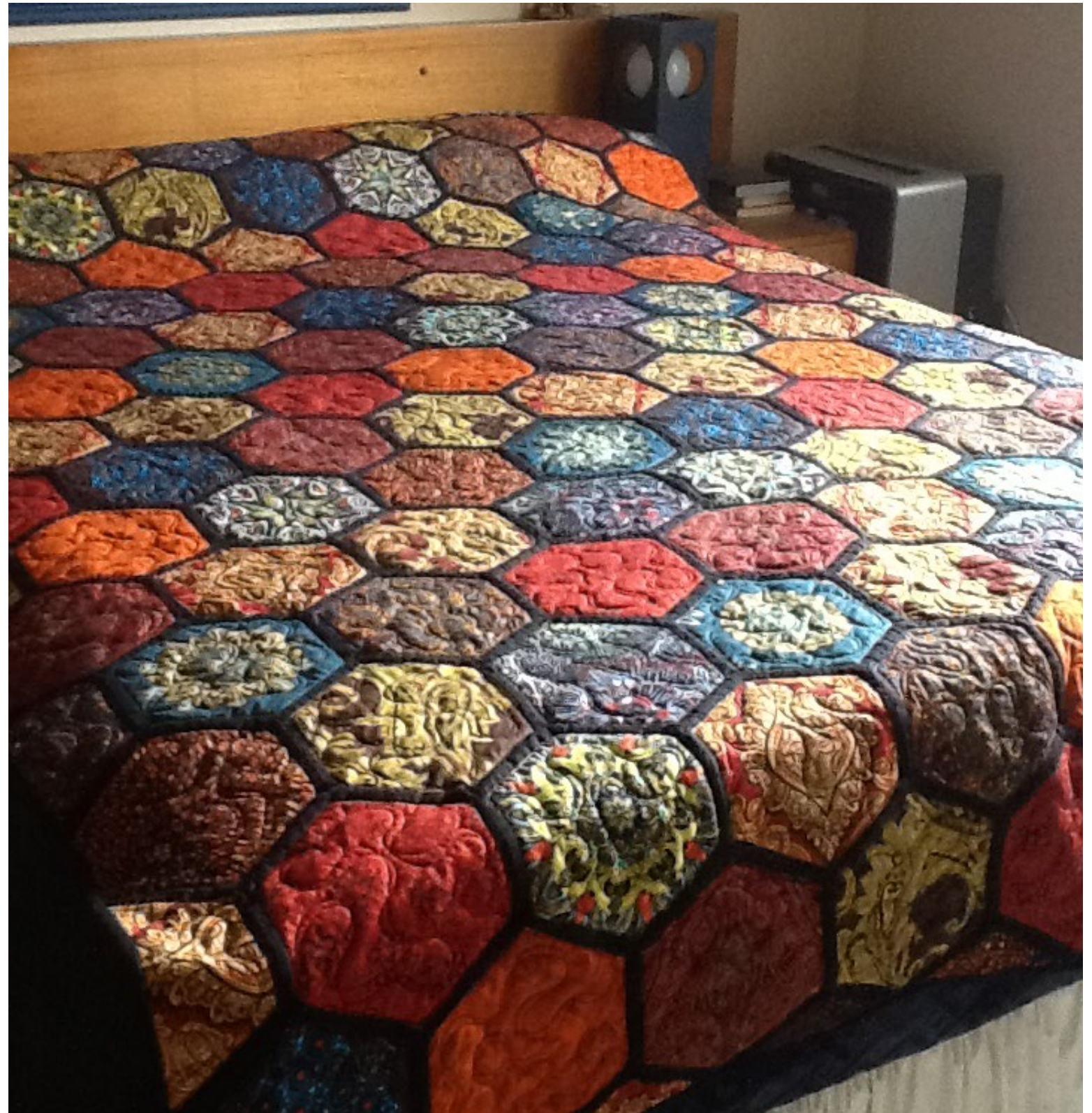
- This was a workshop heart on curved piecing taught by Dianne at Di-versity.
- Margaret made it into a baby quilt in my favorite colours!
- Pieced and quilted by Margaret



Hexagon Quilt

- This is the completed hexagon quilt for Margaret's daughter Renee.
- Each hexagon was fussy cut, no pattern, but help from Dianne at Di-versity.
- Pieced by Margaret
- Quilted by Linda King.
- It's between a double and queen size to fit a specific homemade bed.

- Margaret spent the whole retreat in November 2019 sewing a border around fussy cut hexagons for the quilt for her daughter shown in the previous slide
- This is a smile of relief when the hexagons were completed!



Crib Bumpers Reimagined

- Doffy brought in some baby bumper pads that were being thrown out at Toys R Us.
- Bev channeled her grandmother and took them apart. The padding was turned into 7 dog beds.
- The peach print and grey deer head print are from the bumper pads, while the coral and darker grey were from Bev's stash.
- Bev have not put together a quilt with peach or coral before, but liked the end result.
- This one is 50 x 66. The pattern came from a magazine. Bev stitched in the ditch for this one.

- The other colours were from Bev's stash.
- She made the pattern up to feature some strip quilting and framing some of the deer.
- It ended up being 58 x 82, so will go on one of the beds at our cabin.
- She did some stitching in the ditch and other shapes in the squares.
- Bev (Unfortunately) still has some of the deer fabric left, so it may just be added to another community quilt.)

- She used up fabric leftover from a memory quilt. It turns out there is a lot of quilting in this project (She notice Dianne Jansson’s sample didn’t had all the quilting on the bag) since the quilt designs didn’t match the fabric she choose, so she got to design my own quilting designs.
- The back pocket will hold an iPad and there are inside and outside pockets and a clip for your keys. Not too big, not too small, practical bag.

- Had this really cute cat panel in my staff for almost 10 years.
- Every section was a different size, so Pat had to figure out sashing (thanks Julie O) to put it together, then use the leftover matching fabric to make it large enough for a lap sized quilt.

- Pieced and quilted by Pat

- The Victoria Quilters Guild held a Virtual Retreat June 4th to 6th and everyone loved it!
- Everyone had lots of time to sew, socialize, learn two new patterns, had slide shows on sewing rooms, views out of the quilt room (gardens) and current projects being worked on.

Pat M

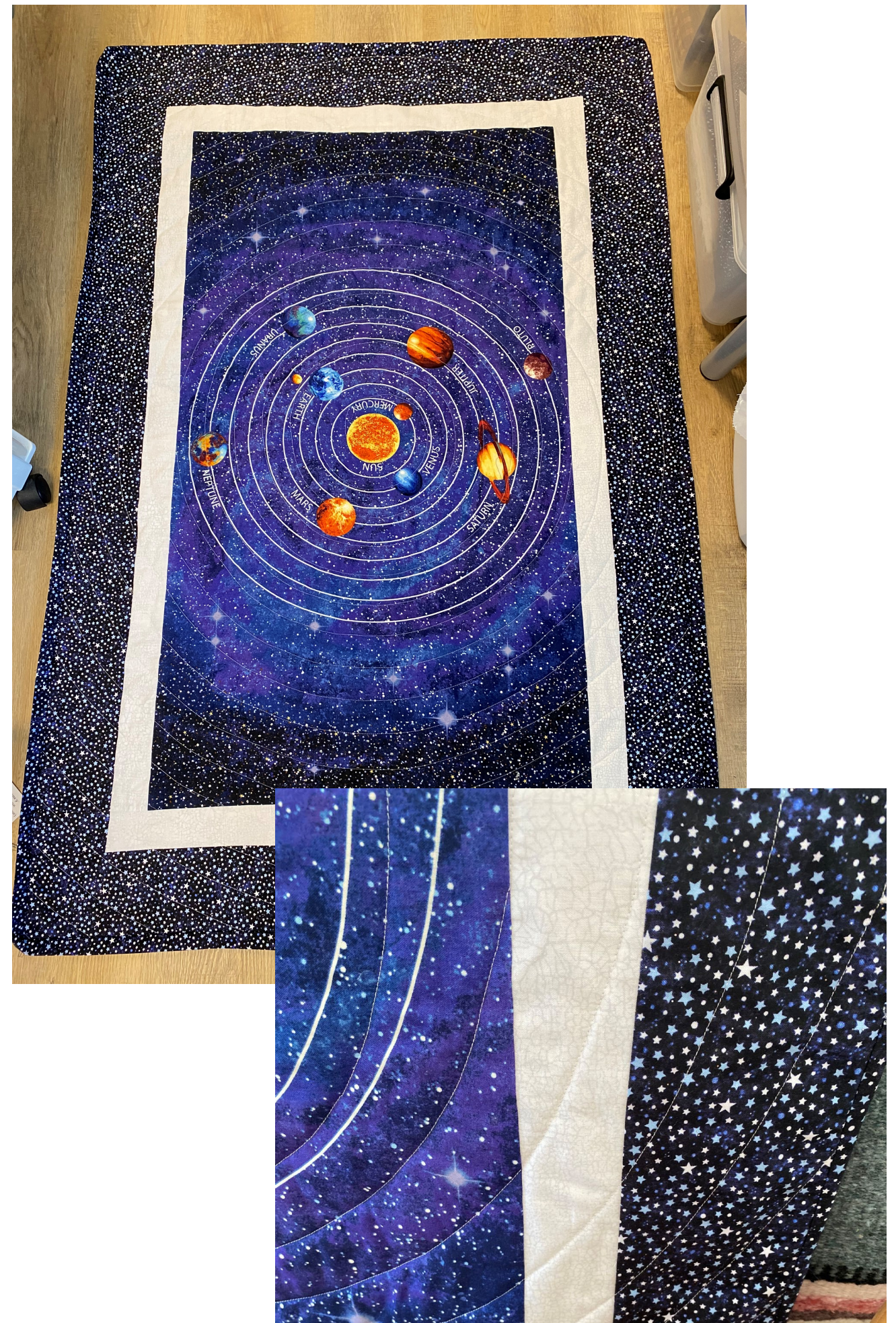
- Another quilt from a class that Lois Toutant taught during the Victoria Quilters Guild Virtual Retreat

Out of this World

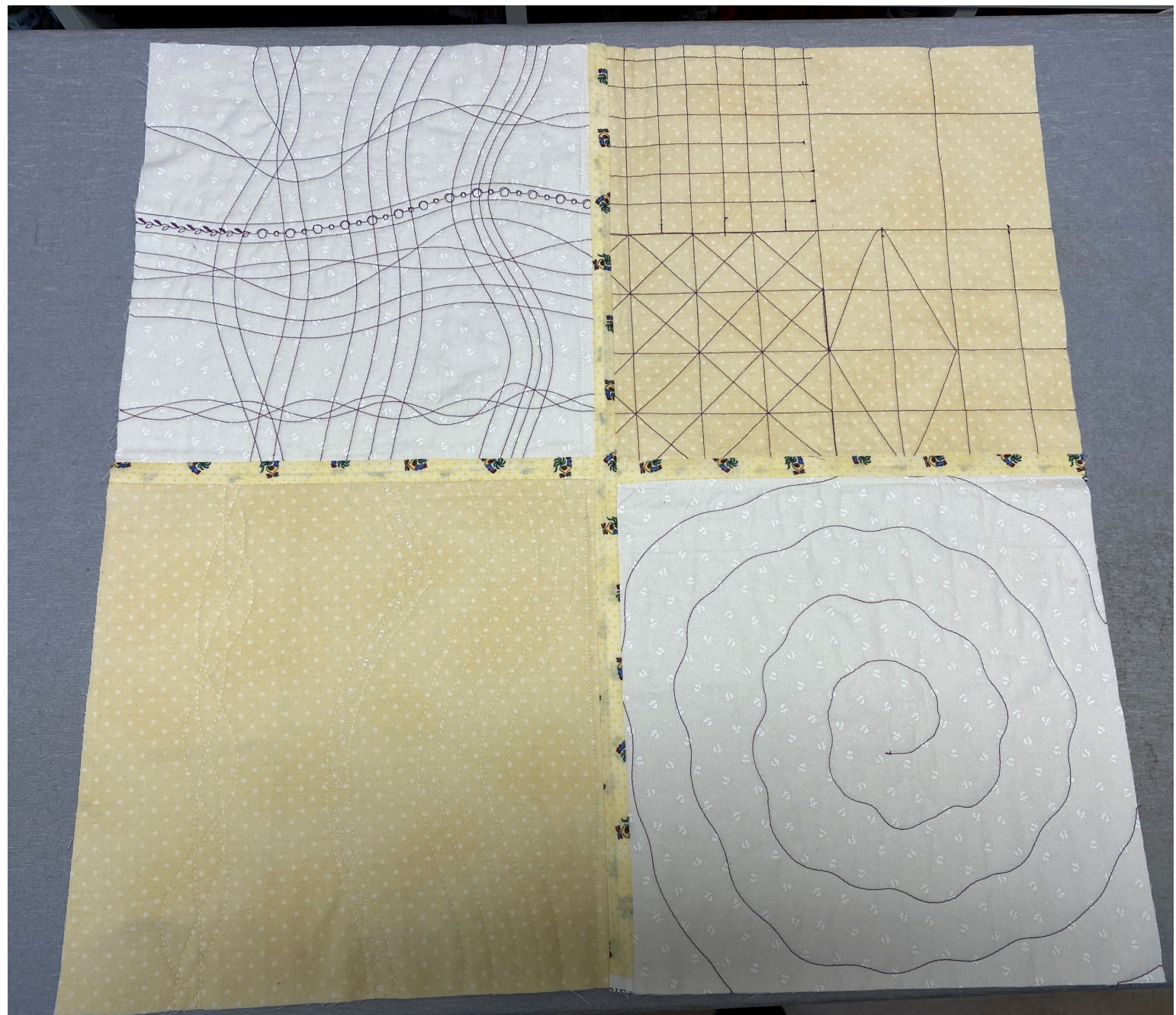
Pat M

- It is for Pat's buddy to match a quilt made years ago for her nephews. Who then gifted the solar system quilt to the new twin granddaughters.
- Pat took a walking foot quilting course and quilted this with a spiral pattern rather than the standard meander pattern.
- The Size is 40 x 60 inches
- Pieced and quilted by Pat

- Then the question of what to do with the demo blocks
- Victoria Quilter's Guild hosted a June 'Stitch Day (hour)' where 'Quilt as You Go' was taught.

- 10.5 inch squares joined together.
- Pieced and quilted by Pat
