### **Year End Quilt Show report**

The decision to hold a quilt show was made last spring. In June an organizing committee was formed and less than 11 months later we had our fabulous show.

There are 3 reasons that we were able to plan and organize the show so quickly:

- 1. We did not have an extended venue search. Monica contacted Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish to enquire about renting the parish hall, several members of the committee did a tour, and it was agreed that this would be our venue.
- 2. The second reason for the success of the show was the hard work and dedication of the committee members, their volunteers and the numerous volunteers who helped at the show itself. We had a good mix of new and experienced committee members, and this allowed us to hit the ground running.
- 3. The third reason was the support of the guild members. We had 45 members display 154 quilts in the show. Monica and I did have some moments of panic near the end on March when we had only 65 quilts registered but we soon had a flood of quilts and were able to display all of them.



Members answered Julie's request for donations for the tearoom with cash donations for fruit and trays of squares and cookies.

The venue chosen had its pros and cons, the gym was large enough to display approximately 200 quilts including the members quilts, Community Quilts and Katherine's Place display, we had full use of the kitchen which allowed us to sell sandwiches and make fruit plates. We id not have to pay rental for setup day, the tables, chairs, and some dividers were provided. We were able to divide the space into quilt display, tearoom, raffle tickets, admission and challenge and merchant mall space.

The cons of the venue were something that many shows struggle with...Parking!...while there was some street parking, and parking at the mall, there was a lack of parking in the parking lot on Friday due to school needs. Also, Church on Saturday started at the same time that that we were hauling pipe and drape taken down and quilts being picked up. The merchants mall could have used a larger room and there was no air conditioning.

The quilt show made a profit of approximately \$7000.00 (final report still to come). This was down from the last show which made a profit of \$11, 500.

There were a few factors that impacted the profit that was realized. The committee decided not to have a sales table, while this was a money maker for the last show, it required selling leftover products at a few Christmas craft fairs and we thought this was not going to be compatible with a spring show.

Another decision was not to seek sponsorship of businesses. It was felt that many businesses especially small business were still trying to recover from the effects of Covid and they would not be able to support the show. Geri-Lou did take it upon herself to seek donations from some businesses that she was associated with through her work and was successful in raising some funds, but this was considerably less than last show. Our costs to produce the show were higher as well.

Our attendance was only slightly lower than the 2017 show, we had 488 attendees, last show had 573. The difference in raffle sales between the two show was about \$330 higher this year.

Feedback from the show was been extremely positive. There were many comments that it was have challenging to pick a viewers Choice quilt as there were so many fabulous quilts. There seemed to be lots of chatting and reunions of old friends and the tearoom tables were buzzing with activity.

### Recommendations for next show:

Start your venue search first, this will impact the entire show planning process. Once you have a venue, have as many committee members as possible go to view the space, take photos, and measurements. Note locations of doorways, exits, electrical outlets. We went back many times for another look, thankfully OLPH was able accommodate this.

Determine the expenses and profit streams. More ways to bring in income are better than just a few. Involve the guild, this is a team effort. Advertise heavily...let everyone know about the show. Enjoy the process and know that in the end it will all be worth it. It certainly was for the 2024 Quilt Show.
