Program Part 1 - Guest Speaker Mellisa Neubauer

Melissa is a Textile teacher that started working with the Community Quilts Project in 2016 in Fort McMurray. The project continued during 2017 & 2018.

Since then, Melissa moved to the Thompson Okanagan area and after the 2023 fires Melissa started a local chapter of the Community Quilts Project, focusing on the North Shuswap area, and especially the Skwlax Band, located on Little Shuswap lake.

Melissa has involved her textiles students at South Kamloops Secondary School (SKSS) in this project. Every grade 8 student, both boys and girls, at SKSS take Textiles as an elective. They get 22 classes of textile each year. They learn how to cut quilt blocks and make a nine patch block. Then the senior textile students assemble the quilts. Melissa brought some quilts to show their work. One was a crazy quilt with self binding. Students get motivated once they see pictures of people receiving the quilt. In the past the students made fidget quilts for Ponderosa Lodge residents.

With quilt donations from the students and guild members, especially Jeri B, Sue O, and Geri-Lou A Melissa donated 30 quilts this year. Based on the possibility of more wildfires this year, Melissa anticipates more quilts will be needed. If you have a quilt to donate, please contact Sue O.

All sizes of quilts are needed and wanted. Melissa says it is very emotional to drop off quilts to Wildfire Victims when they have lost everything.

Program Part 2 - Andrea S

In light of our own upcoming Quilt Show and the Juried Quilt Show at Quilt Canada in Edmonton this June, Andrea discussed the article "<u>Talking About Quilts: How to have richer, more meaningful conversations about quilts</u>" by Frances O'Roark Dowell. QUILTCON Magazine 2023.

Ten Tips For Looking At - And Talking About - Quilts

- 1. **Say what you see.** What colors, shapes, textures, elements do you notice? How is the quilt quilted?
- 2. **Consider the quilt's overall construction.** What techniques has the quilter used in the making of the quilt?
- 3. **Consider the quilt in the context of its category.** How does this quilt reflect the hallmarks that distinguish the category? Does the quilt employ techniques from other categories as well?
- 4. What trends in modern quilting does this quilt reflect? What influences do you see at work in this quilt? How does the quilter make the trend their own?

- 5. What concepts might the quilter have been playing with? Heidi Parkes suggests exploring how the quilter creates meaning. Is the maker primarily interested in exploring a design or technique, or making a statement of some sort.
- 6. Jurors evaluate quilts on visual impact, originality/innovation, visual appeal and composition, and usability/functionality. Given those categories, what do you think stood out for the jurors when they selected this quilt?
- 7. **Are there ways in which this quilt disrupts your expectations?** Are there tensions within the design or construction? (Example: a quilt composed of pink and floral fabrics that bears a message about violence against women.)
- 8. What's original about the quilt? What sets it apart from similar quilts?
- 9. **Consider the quilt in context with the other quilts in the show.** Does it mirror other quilts you've seen? How does it stand apart, if at all?
- 10. **Read the artist's statement about the quilt.** How does it illuminate the quilter's intentions? Does it change how you view or understand the quilt?
