Community quilt kits were available to pick up at the meeting. Members can pick up a kit which includes the fabric and pattern. Once the quilt is pieced then it can be returned to the committee for quilting, the top is then returned to the member (please remember to attach your name on a piece of paper to each quilt top!) for binding.

Desired size for community quilts is 45 to 50" wide by 60 to 65" long.

Block Lotto Julie O.- Julie showed samples of the November block, Carrie Nation. Blocks are due for next meeting **November 24**. Andrea S. shared that she had googled the name Carrie Nation and learned that this was a real person, very interesting history.
